This Indenture made this 11th day of January 1837 between Solomon Beykin of the first part, William Davis Trustee of the second part, and John Nicks, Creditor of the third part, all of the County of Southampton, State of New York that the said Solomon Beykin for the in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said William Davis at or before the concluding and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, as well as the further considerations of the said Solomon Beykin being justly indebted to the said John Nicks in the just and full sum of Twenty five dollars due by him at this time and the obligation to be binding for all bond or accounts which may be justly due at the time we settle or when he is paid off from the sale of the said property, in lawful money worth interest thereon, witness that the said Solomon Beykin is willing to secure the said John Nicks and which is the sole object of these presents, hath granted, bargained, sold & conveyed unto the said William Davis his heirs, executors and assigns one bay Mare, two feather beds and furniture, farming utensil, the present stock of kitchen furniture. I convey unto the said William Davis his heirs executors or assigns forever; but upon this special trust and condition that the said William Davis his heirs or assigns upon being requested by the said John Nicks his heirs or assigns shall make sale of the above mentioned property at public - for the best price that can be obtained, any time after the 10th of January 1837, after advertising ten days previous notice to the day of sale at the Court house ~~here~~ and at as many other places as the said William Davis may see fit, and with the money arising from the said sale, shall first pay the said John Nicks all his claims which he may have as the said Solomon Beykin with respect whereof there on all all cost which may occur in making sales of the same and then pay unto the said Solomon Beykin the surplus, if any, and the said Solomon Beykin for himself, his heirs and assigns do warrant the sale of the aforesaid property unto the said William Davis his heirs and assigns for that purpose, so warrant and forever release again any lawful claim or person whatsoever claiming the same or any part thereof, if the said William Davis for himself his heirs or assigns as agree to make sale of the above mentioned property any time when requested by the said John Nicks or his heirs or assigns. This Indenture made this twentieth day of January in the year 1837 between Henry P. Vaughan of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia of the first part, James M. Parker of the same County & State of the second part, & Alexander P. Hale late of the aforesaid County & State of the third part. Whereas, the said Alexander P. Hale and Mary Eliza his wife, by their said date the 3rd day of September 1831, in order to secure the payment at times therein specified, of several bonds amounting to eight thousand one hundred dollars, owing by him, the said Alexander P. Hale to the said James M. Parker, conveyed in trust to the said Henry P. Vaughan, two certain tracts of land lying in the County & state aforesaid one containing nine hundred & forty two acres bounded by the three banks the lands of Thos. Applewhite & others. The other containing seven hundreds & thirty nine acres bounded by the lands of Thos. Ridley, Amos Stephenson & others it being the same conveyed by Henry P. Vaughan to James M. Parker by Deed dated the 9th day of January 1835, together with the following slaves, Nat, Charles, Sam, Henry, Peter, Ann, Henry, James, Brandy, Patsy, Aggy, Franky, Maria, Harriet & Lucy; and the said sum of eight thousand one hundred dollars banky being fully paid by the said Alexander P. Hale to the said James M. Parker, he, the said Alexander P. Hale both requesting that the estate conveyed by the said deed of trust, to him the said Henry P. Vaughan in the above mentioned lands & negroes to now released to him, the said Alexander P. Hale. This Indenture, therefore, witnesseth, that for & in consideration of the promises & also for & in consideration of one dollar by the said Alexander P. Hale to the said Henry P. Vaughan in hand paid before the sealing
