Vaughan nor either of his heirs nor any other persons whatsoever claiming under him shall by any ways or means hereafter have challenge or demand any estate, right, title or interest, of in or to the said lands & Negroes or any part or parcel thereof, but from all & every action for the recovery thereof, & from all & every estate, right title interest or demand of in or to the said premises or any part thereof. This Indenture made this 21th day of January 1837 between Edmund Halcomb, of the one part, and Benjamin Griffin Sheriff of the County of Southampton of the Other part. Witnesseth that whereas the said Edmund Halcomb, being now in custody of the Sheriff by virtue of an execution sued out of the Circuit Superior Board of Law & Chancery for the County of Southampton in favor of Richard Halcomb and being about to discharge himself from custody by taking the oath of insolvency, hath delivered in a schedule of his whole estate, which among other things of all his undivided interest, in the lands on which his father Richard Halcomb died seized and possessed also another tract of Land on which the said Edmund Halcomb now lives containing 150 acres, it being the same tract or parcels of Land conveyed to him by Miles Scarborough & Wife, Rich. Harris John Harris & Wife & Martha Harris, by reference to the deeds of the said parties, the boundaries thereof will more fully appear: And the said Edmund Halcomb is required previous to being discharged to convey to the Sheriff the aforesaid Tracts of Land. Now therefore this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Edmund Halcomb in consideration of the premises hath given, granted, bargained & sold, & by these presents doth grant, bargain & sell unto the said Benjamin Griffin Sheriff as aforesaid the aforesaid tracts of Land - to him the said Benjamin Griffin Sheriff as aforesaid against the claim of him the said Edmund Halcomb, of all & every other person whatsoever.
