Gute his heirs & assigns forever, so that the said Henry B Vaughan nor either of his heirs, nor any other person whatsoever claiming under him shall by any ways or means hereafter have challenge or demand any estate, right, title or interest, of in or to the said land Negroes or any part or share thereof, but from all & every action for the recovery thereof, & from all & every estate, right title interest or demand of in or to the said premises or any part thereof. Edmund Halcome made This 24th day of January 1837 between Edmund Halcome, of the one part, and Benjamin Griffen Sheriff of the County of Southampton of the other part. Witnesseth that whereas the said Edmund Halcome, being now in custody of the Sheriff by virtue of an execution sued out of the Circuit Superior Court of Law & Chancery for the County of Southampton in favor of Richard Halcome and being about to discharge himself from custody by taking the oath of insolvency, hath delivered in a Schedule of his whole estate, which among other things of all his undivided interest, in the lands on which his father Richard Halcome died, seized and possessed also another tract of Land on which the said Edmund Halcome now lives containing 150 acres, it being the same tract or parcel of land conveyed to him by Miles Scarborough & wife, Richd. Hous John Hous & wife Martha Hous, by reference to the seal of the said parcels, the boundaries thereof will more fully appear. And the said Edmund Halcome is required previous to being discharged to carry to the Sheriff the aforesaid tract of Land. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said Edmund Halcome in consideration of the promises both given, granted, bargained & sold, & by these presents doth grant, bargain & sell unto the said Benja. Griffen Sheriff as aforesaid the aforesaid tract of Lands to him the said Benjamin Griffen Sheriff as aforesaid against the claim of him the said Edmund Halcome, of all & every other person whatsoever.
