This Indenture made and entered into on this 28th day of January 1837 between Everett Bryant one of the Commissioners aforesaid and named in decree of the court for the County of Southampton Dec. Term 1836 requiring him or them the above named Everett Bryant and Casum Bryant and or either of them to sell the lands of which George Williams was tenant by courtesy in right of his Wife which he the said George Williams relinquished to his infant children, with Land lying and being in the County of Southampton, was sold by the above named Everett Bryant one of the said Commissioners on the above given day and date in pursuance of said decree and Casum Bryant became purchaser thereof for the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars and Twenty five cents. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the Comms. aforesaid in consideration aforesaid and in conformity with his duty as Commissioner have and do hereby grant, bargain, sell as by said decree directed, the lands named in said decree and he the said Casum Bryant having at auction become purchaser thereof as aforesaid and also has fully complied with the terms of sale in said case. I Everett Bryant Commissioner sitting herein do hereby grant, bargain and sell to him the said Casum Bryant his heirs and assigns forever, the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land containing by estimation one hundred and three acres (be the same, more or less) and bounded by the lands of the following named persons, to wit Henry Kintock, Andrew Mads, Mills Howell, Everett Bryant, Stovick Bryant and the above named Casum Bryant, to have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and premises with its appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the sd. Casum Bryant his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Everett Bryant Commissioner as aforesaid for himself his heirs executors and administrators the said tract or parcel of Land and premises with all its appurtenances to him the said Casum Bryant his heirs and assigns shall and will by these presents warrant and favors defend the right and title vested in him by virtue of sd. decree against the claim or demands of all or every person or persons whatsoever. In Witness whereof I the sd. Everett Bryant Commissioner as aforesaid have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day and year here in first above written signed sealed and delivered.
