This Indenture, made this sixteenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, between Benjamin Lewis of the County of Southampton of the one part and James Mason of the County of Sussex of the other part, both of the state of Virginia. Witnesseth, that the said Benjamin Lewis for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand six hundred and thirty nine dollars and twenty five cents lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said James Mason at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and conveyed and by these presents do bargain sell and convey unto the said James Mason his heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of Land, situated, lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by recent Survey six hundred and twenty one acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows: Beginning at a Maple all corner on John R. Masons line, thence along his line N 20° E 12 poles, N 10° E of pole to a pine on the Road, thence along the said Road as it meanders to David Barnes's line, thence along his line S 87½° E 112 ½ poles to a pine, S 43° E 77 poles to a pine or corner to Lewis Harris' land, thence along his line S 85° West 34 poles - S 11° W 66 poles S 28° E 71 poles - S 13° N 34 poles - S 45° W 13 ½ poles to a red oak, S 9° E 117 poles to and over Stump on the three corners, thence up the said corner as it meanders to an overcup white oak at corner to John G. Mason, thence along his line due North 31 poles to a poplar sum on Masons Mill swamp, thence up the said swamp as it meanders to the beginning, together with all and singular the appurtenances and premises and the reversion and reversions, remainders and remainders yearly and other rents, issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract of Land and premises with the tenements, hereditaments and all and singular other the promises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof, with every of their rights, members and appurtenances unto the said James Mason his heirs and assigns forever.
