This Indenture, made the sixteenth day of September in the year Eighteen hundred and thirty five, between Thomas Pittlow and Jane, his Wife, of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the one part, and Ethelred Kitchen of the said County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Thomas Pittlow and Kitchen Jane his Wife in consideration of the sum of eighty dollars lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand, wife acknowledged paid by the said Ethelred Kitchen et al before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, and by these presents do and each of them doth, bargain and sell, unto the said Ethelred Kitchen, his heirs and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of land, lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton and State of Virginia and bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at a Red oak in Thomas Pittlow's line and running N. 18° E. 105.6 poles to a R. oak, thence N. 20° E. 36.12 poles to a Red oak, a corner in Mrs. Martha Gardner's line, thence S. 53° W. 33.30 poles a corner, in said line, thence S. 35° W. 64 poles, in old stump at lane, thence S. 16° W. 112 poles to a Maple, a new corner in spacious, thence S. 65° E. 53 poles to the beginning; containing thirty acres together with all the privileges and appurtenances belonging thereto of fruits and profits thereof. To have and to hold the said parcel of land with all and singular the premises mentioned or intimated to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights and appurtenances unto the said Ethelred Kitchen his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Thomas Pittlow and Jane his Wife for themselves and their heirs, the said parcel of land with all and singular the premises and of pertinences thereto belonging unto the said Ethelred Kitchen his heirs and assigns free from the claims or claims of them the said Thomas Pittlow and Jane his Wife, or either of them, their or either of their heirs, and of all and every person or persons whatsoever, shall, will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents. In witness whereof the said Thomas Pittlow and Jane his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written.
