Commissioners to Baykin
This Indenture made the 7th day of February in the year of our Lord 1837 between John Brown & John Mercer of the County of Southampton, Commissioners appointed by the honourable Court of Southampton to sell the lands which Joseph Bailey did seize and possess of, of the one part, and John P. Baykin of the other part of the County of Southampton: Witnesseth, that the said John Brown & John Mercer Commissioners appointed by the aforesaid Court, having date November Eighteen hundred and thirty six, for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred & sixty three dollars to them in hand paid by the said John P. Baykin at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said John P. Baykin his heirs and assigns, all that tract of Land which the said Joseph Bailey did seize and possess of subject to the Widow's dower lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation three hundred and _____ acres be the same more or less adjoining the lands of Joseph D. Council about S.W. and the lands of David L. Baykin and N.E. the Lands of Patrick B. Harrel &c. the lands of William Stephenson & James Jones South, together with all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging, and reversion and reversions, remainder & remainders great and small rents issues and profits and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said title and interest in unto the Tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their right members and appurtenances unto the said John P. Baykin his heirs and assigns forever. And the said John Brown & John Mercer Commissioners do for themselves and their heirs &c. with full power warrant and defend all the right, title and interest in the said Land as far as is vested in them by virtue of the above named decree of the Court free from the claims of them the said John Mercer & John Brown their heirs and assigns. Kitchen & Wife to Naper
This Indenture made this 21st day of January One thousand Eight hundred and thirty seven, between Ethelred Kitchen and Nancy his Wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and James Naper of the same County of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Ethelred Kitchen and Nancy his Wife for an inconsideration of the sum of Fifty dollars to him in hand paid by the said James Naper the receipt whereof the said Ethelred Kitchen and Nancy his Wife do hereby acknowledge themselves fully satisfied and paid hath granted bargained sold and released unto the said James Naper, one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by estimation fifty-two be the same more or less, and bounded as follows, to wit, on the West and North by the lands of James Naper, on the East by the lands of Shyars Lavin on the East by the lands of John D. Mangum, together with all the houses, out houses, orchards, gardens, grounds, ways, water, ways, water courses &c. whatsoever, belonging in any wise appertaining, to have and to hold the said Land to him the said James Naper to him and his heirs forever and the said Ethelred Kitchen and Nancy his Wife doth warrant the right title claim for or any other person claiming the same or any part thereof. And likewise whereof we have hereunto set our
