This Indenture made this 21st day of February 1837 between Sam' Wallace of the first part, Benjamin Cobb of the second part and William Cobb of the third part. Whereas the said Benjamin Cobb, on the 20th day of November 1830 in order to secure the payment of the sum of one hundred and five dollars to the said William Cobb, did by indenture of trust of that date, convey to the said Samuel Wallace his heirs executors &c a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing two hundred and fifty one acres, to the same more or less, lying and being in the County of Southampton, and is that part of the tract of Land, Lazarus Cobb gone by his Will, to Charity Cobb during her life, and at her death to the said Benjamin Cobb in fee simple, except five acres, for a more particular description of said Land reference is had to the Will of said Lazarus Cobb aforesaid. Upon Trust, for the uses and purposes in the said Indenture mentioned. And whereas since the executing and delivery of the said deed of Trust, the said Benjamin Cobb hath fully satisfied and paid to the said William Cobb, the aforesaid sum of Money thereby secured, which the said William Cobb hath hereby acknowledged. Now This Indenture witnesseth that for the consideration aforesaid, as well as for the further consideration, of one dollar, paid by the said Benjamin Cobb to the said Samuel Wallace at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, by the said Samuel Wallace, with the seal and approbation of the said William Cobb, signified by his being a party to these presents, and the said William Cobb hath granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and confirmed unto these presents, as grant bargain and sell advances released and confirmed unto the said Benjamin Cobb, all the estate, right, title, interest claims and demands both at Law and in equity, which the said Samuel Wallace have or have in the land.
