This Indenture made and entered into this the 7th day of March in the year 1837 between James P. Holt of the first part, Bailey Bryant of the second part and Benjamin Lamb of the third part all of the County of Southampton. Witnesseth that whereas the said James P. Holt stands justly indebted unto the said Benjamin Lamb in the sum of four hundred and fifty five dollars by bond bearing equal date with these presents now the said Lamb is security for the said James P. Holt in a bond executed to Robert Ridley administrator of James & Meacham deceased for the sum of forty five dollars due or about the 35th day of December next, and the said Holt being willing and anxious to secure the payment to secure the payment of the said sum of money due the said Lamb and all interest which may accrue thereon as well as to indemnify and save harmlessly the said Lamb as his security aforesaid hath conveyed the property hereinafter mentioned unto the said Bailey Bryant to be sold for that purpose. Now This Indenture witnesseth that the said James P. Holt for and in consideration of the promises as well as for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Bailey Bryant, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, by the said James P. Holt hath given, granted bargained and sold, and by these presents does give grant, bargain & sell unto the said Bailey Bryant his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns the following property to wit one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid, being the land wherein the said Holt now resides containing by estimation one hundred and fifteen acres to the same more or less, also one horse, eleven heads of cattle, eighteen heads of hogs, all the said Holt's household and kitchen furniture and farming utensils and the increase of the said stock. To have and to hold the said land together with the personal property aforesaid and the increase thereof unto him the said Bailey Bryant his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever. Upon this special trust and confidence that the said Bailey Bryant (or in case of his death, for his legal representatives who is hereby authorized to act) at any time hereafter upon being requested so to do by the said Benjamin Lamb his Executors administrators and assigns shall set up and sell the whole or any part of the property aforesaid hereby conveyed having fixed the time and place of sale at his own discretion and given reasonable public notice (hereby for each and out of the monies arising) from such sale after paying the charges thereof and the best attending this Indenture shall pay to the said Benjamin Lamb the amount of the debt aforesaid or such part thereof as may be demanded, as also the debt aforesaid for which the said Lamb is security and the surplus, if any, to the said, his heirs or personal representatives. But should the said Holt pay the debt due the said Lamb as also the debt for which the said Lamb is security, or before the day of sale then this indenture to be null and void or else to remain in full force & virtue.
