This Indenture made this 10th day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Hawkins Pond and Elizabeth his Wife of the County of Surrey of the one part and David Doyal of the County of Southampton of the other part, both of the State of New-Hampshire that for and in consideration of the sum of seven hundred Dollars to him in hand paid or otherwise secured before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said Hawkins Pond and Elizabeth his Wife have bargained and sell enfeof and confirm unto the said David Doyal his heirs and assigns forever all his right, title, claim, interest and demands, in or to certain tract or parcel of land with the exception of the grave yard and one acre of Lands attached thereto lying and situated in the County of Southampton, and bounded by Thomas Gray, Richd Kelsoe, Henry Pickers, James Senior James Barber and Archer Pond containing four hundred Acres be the same more or less and being the plantation whereon John St. Pond formerly lived. To have and to hold, the said right and interest in the said tract or parcel of Lands to the said David Doyal his heirs and assigns to their proper use and behoof forever. And the said Hawkins Pond and Elizabeth his wife, do further covenant to and with the said David Doyal that this present deed of bargain and sale shall be unto him the said David Doyal his heirs and assigns forever a good and sufficient warranty against him the said Hawkins Pond and Elizabeth his Wife their heirs and assigns as well as against the right, title claim and demand of all and every other person or persons claiming by, through or under him. This Indenture made this 28th day of March 1837 between Edmund Holcomb of the one part and Jeremiah Cobb of the other part (all of the County of Southampton) New-Hampshire that the said Edmund Holcomb in consideration of thirty dollars in hand paid, by the said Jeremiah Cobb at or before the enrolling and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have bargained and sell and by these presents do bargain & sell unto the said Jeremiah Cobb, his heirs and assigns about fifteen acres of Land, be the same, more or less, and bounded as follows, beginning at the landing on Noddaway River (a place known by that name) at a swash dividing the low grounds from the high land, and running up the said swash till it strikes Jesse Cobbs line thence of the said well known line to Noddaway River and thence down the said River to the beginning, including the well known fishing place and brook on said River, together with all the fishings emoluments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of Land, or with the same now or enjoyed, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders present and other rents and profits thereof, and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with all the emoluments, hereditaments and all and singular the appurtenances and premises herein
