This Indenture made this 29th day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Robert Drewry and Richard A. Rells Commissioners acting under a decree of the County Court of Southampton off the one part and Lewis N. Branch of the aforesaid County of the other part. Now whereas that for and in consideration of the sum of sixty seven dollars and 9 cents good and lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid, at or before the making of this present, by the said Lewis N. Branch, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents as bargains & sells unto the said Lewis N. Branch his heirs & assigns forever all that certain tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging situated lying & being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing two hundred & eighty one acres - 1/2 of which subject to the aboves power to whom was allotted one hundred & thirty nine acres PR 2d & bounded as follows - west by the Cross Roads tract north by the lands of Mrs Patsey Hancock & Mrs Eliza St. Johnson, south by the lands of George Branch, Walter G.
