This Indenture

made this twenty ninth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Richard McKello and Robert Drury, Commissioners acting under a score of the Court of Southampton of the one part and Sweet Branch of the County of Southampton of the other part: Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and twenty seven pounds and forty four cents current money of Virginia to them in hand paid at or before the enrolling and delivery of these presents, by the said Sweet Branch the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Sweet Branch his heirs and assigns forever all that certain tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging situated lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing one hundred and sixty seven acres two acres & twenty five poles, by metes survey and bounds as follows. North by the lands of William Lane. East by the lands of J. J. Currell, South by the lands of said Currell, William L. Bailey and Mrs Nancy Hancock and West by the Barrapine Swamp separating the said land from the lands of Mrs Jane Brattle, being the tract formerly owned by and known as the land of Sweet Branch and sold as a part of the estate of George Branch and together with all and singular the houses or sheds and appurtenances thereto belonging, the severance and accessories, remainders and remainders, rents and other rents (uses and profits) thereof. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements, hereditaments, hereditaments and all and singular the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Sweet Branch his heirs and assigns forever; and the said Richard McKello and Robert Drury as Commissioners acting under the aforesaid score for themselves and their heirs the said tract of land with all and singular other the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Sweet Branch his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall and if so warrant and forever defend by these presents. This Indenture made and entered into this 26th day of March in the year of 1837 between Mills Norrell of the one part and William Norrell of the other part both of the County of Southampton and State of Va. and Henry Hindors of the third part of the aforesaid County: Witnesseth whereas the aforesaid Mills Norrell hath become justly indebted in a certain obligation bearing date from the 1st day of Jan'y 1837 of the sum of Two hundred, forty six dollars and 25/100, to wit, whereas the said Mills Norrell was willingly & assensuous of securing the said William Norrell in the above sum of four hundred, forty six dollars and 25/100. Now this Indenture further witnesseth that the said Mills Norrell hath for an inconsideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Henry Hindors, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, doth grant, bargain and sell and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the sd. Henry Hindors his heirs or assigns forever the following property to wit, one lot, tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and State of Va. and sit being the tract whereon the said Mills Norrell now resides upon contain one hundred and forty four acres it being the same more or less, bounded as follows to wit by the lands belonging to Jacob Roberts, James Norrell, Nesty Pope and by the heirs of Andrew Norrell dead. To have and to hold the aforesaid lot, tract or parcel of Land with all its appurtenances to him the aforesaid Henry Hindors his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Henry Hindors, him and his heirs forever; Upon this special Trust and confidence nevertheless, to wit for the use intents and purposes following. Viz. the said Henry Hindors at any time hereafter whenever he shall be required by the said William Norrell his heirs or assigns, make sale of the aforesaid lot, tract or parcel of Land (being bounded as aforesaid)
