Whereas I, that is and in consideration of the affection and regard I have and bear towards Elizabeth Craun, the wife of my deceased brother Robert Craun, and also the children of the same, to wit, Emma, Eleanor, Margaret, Melonotho, James & Robert, and being anxious to secure to them a home and place of residence, I do by this indenture lend to them the said Elizabeth Craun and each and every of the children above named, the tract of land known as the Bridge tract the late Residence of Robert Craun and lately sold under a deed of trust, and purchased by me, and bounded as follows commencing at the Round Hill Bridge and running thence, with the Smithfield Road to Honour's line near the store, thence by Honour's line to Sam'l M. Potts line thence along Sam'l M. Potts line to Mr. Hoad's line thence to the beginning, contain forty acres more or less with this proviso particularly that so long as they shall feel disposed to remain on the above named land they shall so do but when either shall marry, or have a disposition to leave the same all interest in the aforesaid land shall then be forfeited by their marrying or removing, but the title as vested herein as lent, shall devolve to the single and unmarried, so long as she shall have a wish to remain residents of the same.
