This Indenture made this 25th day of January in the year of our Lord Christ eighteen hundred and fifty seven between Eliash Whitfield of the one part and James McClenny of the other part all of the County of Southampton, Parish of Notteway, and State of Virginia. Whitfield that the said Eliash Whitfield in consideration of the sum of Three hundred dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth, to him in hand paid by the said James McClenny at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said James McClenny his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land and premises containing estimation one hundred & sixty acres more or less bounded as follows beginning at a post oak corner tree of John Harris line, thence a line of marked trees to gravel Run in Col. Joiner's line thence up said Run to a black gum at corner in the land belonging to the heir of Wilson Wade, thence a line as the line now runs to a red pine corner in John Harris and said Wade's thence a line of marked trees to a post oak at corner in poor house land thence to the beginning together with all and singular the houses out houses edifices buildings yards gardens ways waters & water courses conveinances, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said 160 acres of land belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same or any part or parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said 160 acres of land with the hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging with every part and parcel thereof unto the said James McClenny his heirs assigns forever. To and for the only uses and behoof of him the said James McClenny his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Eliash Whitfield for himself his heirs the said land, with all and singular the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be sold to the said James McClenny his heirs and assigns free from the claim of him the said Eliash Whitfield and his heirs.
