This Indenture made this 25th day of January in the year of our Lord Christ eighteen hundred and thirty seven between Elisha Whitfield of the one part and James McClerny of the other part all of the County of Southampton, Parish of Waterway, and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Elisha Whitfield in consideration of the sum of Three hundred dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth, to him in hand paid by said James McClerny, at or before the enrolling and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged here bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said James McClerny his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land and premises containing estimation one hundred & sixty three acres or less and bounded as follows beginning at a post oak corner tree of John Harris line, thence a line of marked trees to granly Run in Ed. Joiners line, thence up said Run to a black gum corner in the land belonging to the heir of Nelson Wade, thence a line as the lane now runs to a dead spine corner in John Harris and said Wade thence a line of marked trees to a post oak corner in poor house land & thence to the beginning together with all and singular the houses and houses edifices, buildings, yards, gardens ways waters & water courses, commodities, advantages, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said 163 acres of land belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same or any part or parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said 163 acres of land with the hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging with every part and parcel thereof unto the said James McClerny his heirs and assigns forever, to use for the only proper use and behoof of him the said James McClerny his heirs and assigns forever.
