This Indenture was acknowledged by Jesse Bulls a party thereto to be his act and deed, and admitted to record as to him. And in said office the 20th day of March 1837, the same was, approved, as to Henry Bulls by the oath of James Clayton and James C. Clayton Witnesses thereto, and on the 17th day of April 1837 the same was fully approved by the oath of 6 S. 600 also a Witness thereto and admitted to record as to him. And at a Court held for said County the 10th day of May 1837 the said Indenture was entered upon the proceedings of the day.

This Indenture made this 11th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty seven between Thomas Drury and Pamela his Wife of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia of the one part & Jesse Bulls of the same County & State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Thomas Drury & Pamela his wife for the consideration of the sum of Twenty six dollars & eighty cents current money of Virginia due to them in hand paid by the said Jesse Bulls at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained & sold & by these presents do grant bargain & sell, alien, release, convey & confirm unto the said Jesse Bulls his heirs or assigns, a piece of Land cut off from the said Drury's land containing by estimation 13 A 1 R & 24 poles commencing from a post oak near the corner near the corner of said Drury's field to a crooked pine in bottom, from pine along along a line of marked trees by said Drury & Bulls in a straight direction to a small branch, thence along a straight line to Stb near said Drury's field (pond), thence along the high Water mark to Stb near a bottom, thence a straight line to a pine in said Drury's line thence along the original line between said Drury & Jesse Bulls heirs to beginning), to have and to hold the said tenement, tract or parcel of Land with every thing thereto belonging. And the said Thomas Drury & Pamela his Wife do hereby promise and agree for themselves their heirs executors and administrators to & with the said Jesse Bulls his heirs and assigns to warrant secure & forever defend, the said tenement, tract or parcel of Land & premises, against the lawful claim and demands of all & every persons whomsoever. In Witness whereof the said Thomas Drury & Pamela his wife have hereunto set their hands & affixed their seals this day & year above written.
