This Indenture was acknowledged by Thomas Dorey, a party thereto, to be his act and deed made together with the certificate annexed of the poor examination and acknowledgment of the wife, admitted to record. And at a Court held for the County aforesaid the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1837 the said Indenture was entered upon the proceedings of the day.

This Indenture made this 17<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Anselm Bailey (the debtor) of the first part, Robert Dorey (the trustee) of the first part and James Denow (the creditor) of the third part: Whereas the said Anselm Bailey is justly indebted to the said James Denow in the sum of Fifty dollars to be paid on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven as by bond bearing date on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven more fully appears which (with the legal interest thereon according) the said Anselm Bailey is willing and desirous to settle: Now This Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said Anselm Bailey (the debtor) in hand paid by the said Robert Dorey (the trustee) at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. The the said Anselm Bailey hath given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed released and confirmed unto the said Robert Dorey, grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff release and confirm to the said Robert Dorey his heirs and assigns forever the following property. Now two feather beds, bedsteads and furniture, two Chest, two Tables one Shillit, two poles no hammock, one shot gun, eight chairs, 1 stt knives & forks, two dog plates, 1 dog cups & saucers, one looking glass 1 spinning wheel, two Trunks 1 looking glass one pair andirons, one pair flat irons 1 Table, 4 Trays, the rest of things &c &c. with all and singular the appurtenances to the said property belonging or in any wise appertaining, and all the estate right, title and interest of the said Anselm Bailey in and to the said granted or intended to be hereby granted, to the said Robert Dorey his heirs executors, administrators and assigns forever. And the said Anselm Bailey for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators, doth hereby covenant promise and agree to and with the said Robert Dorey his heirs executors, administrators and assigns forever, in manner and form following, that is to say, that the said Anselm Bailey his heirs executors and administrators the aforesaid property and the said Robert Dorey his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, against all persons whatever, shall and will warrant and garnish defend by these presents: Upon trust nevertheless that the said Robert Dorey his heirs executors, administrators shall permit the said Anselm Bailey to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said property hereby conveyed and take the profits thereof to his own use, until default be made in the payment of the said sum of Fifty dollars either in whole or in part: and then upon this further trust that they be now two of them, or the survivor of him or the heirs execs. admrs or assignis of such survivor, shall and will so soon after the happening of such default of payment as they or any or either of them is the survivor of them or the heirs executors administrators or assignis of such survivor may think proper as the said Robert Dorey executors administrators or assignis shall request, sell the said property, hereby conveyed or such part of the hereby granted promises as the trustee or his representatives hereby authorized to act shall think sufficient for the purpose and shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at publick auction, after having fixed the time and place of sale at their own discretion and giving ten day notice thereof by advertisement least up at the door of the Court House in Southampton County, on some Court day previous to the day of sale, and out of the monies arising from such sale, shall after satisfying the charges thereon and all other expenses incident to the premises, pay to the said James Denow executors administrators or assignis the said sum of Fifty dollars with the interest which may thence lawfully have accrued: and the balance if any shall pay to the said Anselm Bailey his heirs, executors, admrs or assignis: But of the whole of the said sum of fifty dollars shall be fully paid off and discharged to the said James Denow executors, administrators or assignis on or before the 17<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven when the same is payable so that no default of payment of the said sum of Fifty dollars be made then this indenture to be void, notwithstanding the same lawfully have accrued: And witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written.
