This Indenture made and entered into this 11th day of October in the year 1834 between George M. Pate of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and John B. Mason of the County of — and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said George M. Pate for and in consideration of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Mason at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof the said George M. Pate doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold unto the said Mason his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing by estimation nineteen and one-fifth acres to the same more or less, it being his undivided fifth part of the lands situate in the County aforesaid which were allotted to Theophania L. Pate as his share of Thomas Pate's lands and which by his death descended to her brothers and sisters of whom the said George M. Pate is one, together with all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land unto the said Mason his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of the said Mason his heirs and assigns forever. And the said George M. Pate for himself his heirs executors and administrators the said tract or parcel of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Mason his heirs and assigns free from the claims or claims of them the said George M. Pate or his heirs and of all and every persons or persons whatsoever still, well and so warrant and forever defend by these presents. In Witness whereof the said George M. This Indenture made and entered into on this 28th day of February in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty seven between Doremy Deal part of the first part, Benjamin Whitfield Trustee of the second part and Henry Bishop of the third part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas the said Doremy Deal is justly indebted to the said Henry Bishop by Note bearing even date with these presents for the sum of thirty-five dollars with the interest thereon accruing, the said Doremy Deal is willing and desirous to secure, to the said Henry Bishop— Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Benjamin Whitfield at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold unto the said Benjamin Whitfield his heirs and assigns forever, the following property, to wit, two feather beds and furniture, 1 chest, 1 trunk, one Mahogany safe two tables two looking glasses, 1 letter case, six chair frames, one bay horse, eleven head hags, 1 loom and gear, three iron pots, 1 spider, 1 Dutch oven 1 skillet, shovel & tongs 1 pair scissors 1 pair smooth irons, iron pot rack 1 cart and wheels, two axes, two wood hoes 2 plough frames and three ploughs here— To have and to hold the above named property unto him the said Benjamin Whitfield his heirs executors, admors. and assigns forever and the said Doremy Deal for himself his heirs executors and admors. doth hereby covenant promises and agree to and with the said Benjamin Whitfield his heirs executors admors. and assigns forever in manner and form following that is to say that the said Doremy Deal his heirs executors and admors. the aforesaid property unto the said Benjamin Whitfield his heirs executors admors. and assigns against all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Benjamin Whitfield shall permit the said Doremy Deal to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the of the aforesaid property until default in the payment of the aforesaid sum of thirty five dollars and the interest thereon accruing either in whole or in part, and thereupon this further trust that he the said Benjamin Whitfield
