Pace doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and by these presents with grant bargain and sell also enfeoff and conform unto the said Mason his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing by estimation nineteen and one-fifth acres of the same more or less. It being his undivided fifth part of the lands situate in the County aforesaid which were allotted to Shepherdia C. Pace as his share of Thomas Pace's lands and which by her death descended to her brothers and sisters of whom the said George M. Pace is one, together with all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land unto the said Mason his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoef of the said Mason his heirs and assigns forever. Whereas the said Dredge Real is justly indebted to the said Henry Bishop by Note bearing even date with these presents for the sum of thirty five dollars with the interest thereon according, the said Dredge Real is willing and desirous to secure, to the said Henry Bishop. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Benjamin Whifield at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents with grant bargain and sell unto the said Benjamin Whifield his heirs and assigns forever, the following property, to wit, two feather beds and furniture, 1 chest, 1 trunk, one Walnut safe two Taller two looking glasses, 1 bottle case, six chair frames, one bay horse, eleven head hogs, 1 boar and gear, three iron pots, 1 spider, 1 Dutch oven 1 Skillet, shovel & tongs 1 pair and iron 1 pair smooth iron, 1 iron pot rack, 1 cart and wheels, two axes, two wood hoes 2 plough frames and three plough hoes — to have and to hold the above named property unto him the said Benjamin Whifield his heirs executors, administrators and assigns forever and the said Dredge Real for himself his heirs executors and administrators with hereby covenant promises and agree to and with the said Benjamin Whifield his heirs executors, administrators and assigns forever in manner and form following (that is to say that the said Dredge Real his heirs executors and administrators the aforesaid property unto the said Benjamin Whifield his heirs executors, administrators and assigns against all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents) Upon Trust nevertheless that the said Benjamin Whifield shall permit the said Dredge Real to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the aforesaid property notwithstanding the payment of the aforesaid sum of thirty five dollars and the interest thereon according either in whole or in part, and then upon this further trust that he the said Benjamin Whifield
