being the tract formerly belonging to Thomas Camp Jr. dec'd and bounded by the road leading from  
Jerusalem to Monroe, the land of Richard, Garrett, Wells Murphy and Stephen Murchough.  
To have and to hold said tract of land with the Rents and all and singular the premises  
therein before mentioned or intended to be bargained, and sold with every part and parcel thereof  
unto him the said Wells Murphy his heirs and assigns forever. And the said James Wells for himself  
and his heirs the said tract of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances unto  
the said Wells Murphy his heirs and assigns free from the claim of him the said James Wells and  
his heirs and of all and every person whatsoever shall will and do warrant and forever defend by

bargained and sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, and sell,  
alien, enfeoff and confirm unto the said Robert Drewry, one certain tract plantation or parcel of land con-  
taining by estimation one hundred acres, or the same more or less, lying and being situated in the County  
of Southampton and State aforesaid, and bounded as follows, beginning at Round Hill bridge, thence the  
various courses down the said Round Hill swamp to Richard Stephensons line, thence up the branch on
