And whereas in pursuance of said decree the said Jeph Parker, Harrison Parker, & Elisha Darden Commissioners aforesaid, did on the 3d day of September, after having first set apart the dower aforesaid on the premises exposed to sale to the highest bidder the tract or parcel of land lying on the east side of the Cedar Swamp in So. Hampton County, containing thirty eight acres more or less - notice of the time and place of sale having been given previous thereto in conformity to said decree: when John Cobb became the purchaser of the said tract or parcel of land, subject to the dower aforesaid, for the sum of Ninety five dollars and fifty Cents. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John Cobb his heirs and assigns, against the claims or claims, demand or demands of whom the said Jeph Parker and Harrison Parker and Elisha Darden or either of them, their or either of their heirs, shall, will and may warrant and defend by virtue of this decree aforesaid and no more.
