Know all men by these presents that I Henry B. Vaughan, of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, have manumitted, emancipated and set free, by these presents do manumit and emancipate that free negro woman slave named Henrietta and thereby declare her the said Henrietta to be entirely liberated from slavery, and entitled to the rights and privileges of a free person with which it is in my power and will have she the said Henrietta hereby emancipated, is a woman of very bright or yellow complexion, or a malle, about five feet six or seven inches high, and will be seventeen years old on the 20th day of December next. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal this 15th day of June one thousand eight hundred thirty seven.

Know all men by these presents that I Matthew Tomlin of the County of Madison and State of Tennessee have for divers good causes and considerations me hereunto moving, nominated, made, constituted and appointed and by these presents do nominate, make constitute and appoint Mathew Debby of the County and State aforesaid my true effectual and lawful attorney in fact for me and in my name, place, room and stead, to ask, demand, receive, accept & for all monies, notes, bonds, and obligations and estate or property of whatsoever sort or kind and description whatsoever I am, have been or may hereafter be entitled to in right of my Wife Nancy Tomlin formerly Nancy Ferguson or otherwise of the estate of the late William Ferguson dec^d late of the County of Southampton in the Commonwealth of Virginia, and also the estate of Edith Ferguson who was the relict and Widow of said William Ferguson of said County of Southampton and also of the estate of Lydia Ferguson late of said County of Southampton. Also Robert Ferguson dec^d late of said County of Southampton or any other legacy or estate of money or property whatsoever from any and all persons. In the hands of the Executor adm^r of either of the above named deceased persons and in the hands any other person or persons whatsoever or in whatever whatsoever residing in the said County Southampton or elsewhere. And in the event any such money estate, legacy or property in the hands of any Executor adm^r of any of the before named deceased persons upon demand of my said attorney, shall neglect or refuse to pay over to my said attorney the money, estate or other property by any of the ways herein named, then and in that case my said attorney is hereby authorized and empowered to institute and carry on any suit in Law or Equity necessary for the recovery of my said money or estate or property aforesaid and to do and every thing necessary to be done for the proper obtaining of judgment and final recovery of my said money estate or property or any part thereof and to give release and acquittances, receipts and discharged or any other matter or thing necessary in and about the premises, hereby ratifying, making effectual and confirming whatsoever my said attorney may lawfully do in and about the premises in a full and complete manner as if I myself were personally present and done by myself.
