This Indenture made and entered into this first day of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty six between  
Jethro Darden and Martha his wife of the first part and Cawin Harris of the second part all of the County of Southampton  
in and State of Virginia Minispeth, that for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars in hand paid by the  
said Harris the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Jethro Darden and Martha his wife have granted, bargained  
and sold unto the said Cawin Harris and certain tract or parcel of Land lying &  
being in the County and State aforesaid containing one hundred acres to the same more or less, situated on the South side of  
Blount Swamp and bounded as follows on the North by the said swamp, and on the other boundaries by the lands of Newt  
Harris and James Doorell being all the land on that side of the swamp which said Darden derived by his wife from the  
estate of his father John Whitfield and to her and a heire to the said Harris, the above tract of land with the fore  
going improvements and appurtenances thereto belonging: And the the said Jethro Darden and Martha his wife as hereby  
warrant and for ever assigns the title of the said Land to the said Cawin Harris to him and his heirs forever against  
the claim or claims of any and every individual whatever else Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and  
affixed our seals the day and date first above written.
