This Indenture made and entered into this 19th day of June 1837 between Henry Joyner of the first part Henry Kinard of the second part and William Norrell of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia: Witnesseth whereas the the said Henry Kinard hath become security for the said Henry Joyner on a certain money obligatory borrowing equal date with a bond of one thousand dollars carry interest from the 25th March 1837 another bond carrying interest from the same date not returnable until Decm<sup>r</sup> 25th 1838 of \$250 to Samuel Emory, in wit. whereas the said Henry Joyner is willing and desirous of securing the said Henry Kinard on the above sum of fifteen hundred dollars and enters as security for the aforesaid Now this indenture further witnesseth that the said Henry Joyner hath for an inconsideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said William Norrell, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold by these presents does grant bargain and sell unto William Norrell his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit all my interest in lands one acre and half parcelled of the aforesaid Samuel Drury and all these appurtenances also one Negro man named Dick to have and to hold the aforesaid property to him the aforesaid William Norrell his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behalf of him the said William Norrell his heirs and assigns upon this special trust and confidence never to be sold or used for the use, intents and purposes following Viz that the said William Norrell at any time hereafter whenever he shall be requested by the said Henry Kinard to make of the aforesaid property at publick auction or so much thereof as to pay and to satisfy the aforesaid claims with interest and cost that may become thereon that the said Henry Kinard was bound on as security aforesaid by advertising the day and place of sale at three publick places at the said William Norrell may think proper so as to render complete justice to the parties at least ten day previous to the day of sale for ready and lawful money of Virginia and out of the proceeds of such sale pay unto Henry Kinard as security aforesaid the full amount of the above claims together with the interest thereon and cost of the carrying into effect of these presents and the overplus of any pay and the said Henry Joyner his heirs and assigns.
