This Indenture made this 18th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty  
 seven between Jacob Senow of the one part and Thomas J. Brister of the other part both of the County of Southampton  
 and state of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Jacob Senow for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred &  
 fifteen dollars to him in hand paid or to be paid by the said Thomas J. Brister the receipt whereof is  
 hereby acknowledged myself fully satisfied and of the same date by these presents acquit the said Thomas J. Brister  
 he the said Jacob Senow hath granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents  
 do grant bargain and sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Thomas J. Brister and his heirs forever one cer-  
 tain tract or parcel of Lands lying and being in the County aforesaid which was given to me by my father  
 Henry Senow decd in his last Will & Testament. reference to which will more fully and at large apper-  
 taining by estimation four hundred and ninety two acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows  
 beginning at a black gum in Sarah's branch thence along said Senow's line to a white oak a corner tree in  
 Milers line thence a South course along said Milers line to two white  
 oaks near a branch thence up said branch a Southwest course crossing the road to a pine near a round pond  
 thence a line of marked trees to a white oak a corner thence in Milers Broadshaws line thence east course  
 along said Broadshaws line to a pine then making a line a South course along said Broadshaws line to a pine  
 a corner tree in Benjamin Cliffens line thence and east course along said Cliffens line to a white oak a  
 corner tree in Allen Edwards line thence a North course along said Edwards line to a steeping post oak a  
 corner tree in Samuel Bennetts line thence along said Bennetts line a cross the road to a white oak a corner  
 tree in James Senow line in Sarah's branch thence down the said branch to the black gum first mentioned thence  
 (belonging) as in any writ appertaining with reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders unto the said  
 thence and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said bargained premises with the appertinances  
 unto the said Thomas J. Brister his heirs and assigns forever and the said Jacob Senow for himself his heirs executors  
 and administrators the said bargained premises and every part and parcel thereof with all their appertinances clear and  
 empt and secure from all claim or their incumbrances whatever unto the said Thomas J. Brister his heirs and assigns  
 and against all and every person or persons claiming. does shall and will by these presents forever warrant and defend  
 In Witness whereof the said Jacob Senow have hereunto set his hand and seal this day and year first above written.
