This Indenture made and entered into this 11. day of June one Thousand one Thousand eight hundred and thirty seven
 in anno Domini by Jacob J. Williams of Southampton County, & State of Virginia of the first part & Jefco Parker
 of the County and State aforesaid of the date part & forth D. Williams of the same County and state of the said
 County that whereas the said Jacob J. Williams stands justly indebted to the said Jefco Parker as aforesaid
 Delivered to him for the said Jacob J. Williams (to wit) one note in favour A. L. Gurnett for the sum of Seven hundred and
 Eight dollars (the said note bearing) date 11. day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty five also one note for
 Dated 1838
 and J. D. Williams thirty five dollars made payable to the said Jefco Parker bearing date this 1st day of June one thousand eight
 hundred & Thirty seven payable from date also one in favour of both D. Williams for the sum of ninety two
 dollars & thirty eight cents bearing date this 11. day of June one thousand eight hundred & Thirty seven now
 the said Jacob J. Williams being anxious to indemnify & secure the payment of the above debts but more especially
 Examined
 for the sum of one dollar to him the said Jacob J. Williams in hands paid by the said both D. Williams in
 hand (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged) the execution and delivery of these presents. Now that the said
 J. J. Williams hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell to the said both
 D. Williams his heirs and assigns the following property forever to wit, 1 negro woman named Lucy, 2 horses, 2
 cows 6 swine and furniture 1 Washbowl & Bureau, 1 large marble glass & Clock, 1 set of Pictures & 2
 writing chairs, 1 Washstand & candlestand 2 Tables, 1 set Blacksmith tools, all my farming utensils seven head
 cattle, corn, fodder. And all my growing crop of corn fodder, pease, platters &c and all my other property
 not mentioned in this deed to him the said both D. Williams on trust to wit that of the said J. J. Williams shall first
 pay and discharge the above debts and all cost pertaining to this trust it shall be lawful and right in that event for him
 the said both D. Williams as soon as requested in writing by him the said Jefco Parker his heirs or assigns to sell of
 and sell for back the above property after giving public notice by advertisement to be set up at different places in
 the neighborhood of the said J. J. Williams at least fifteen days previous to the day of sale, and of the proceeds
 of sale sell first for the above debts and cost pertaining to this trust and the overplus if any to be given to
 him the said J. J. Williams his heirs or assigns. In testimony of which we the parties have hereunto set

 by the court of Southampton County to serve as Constable within the Lower district of St. Luke's Parish in the said
 County for the term of two years from the date hereof. Now if the said James D. Bryant shall well and truly, discharge the
 duties of the office of constable within the said district during his unintermission in office then this obligation to be null and
 void to remain in full force by virtue.
