

Know all men by these presents that we Jeremiah Stephenson, Nathan Pope & David Newsum are heirs and former owners unto David Campbell Esq Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the just and full sum of two thousand dollars, to which payment well and truly to be made to the said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth, we bind ourselves our heirs executors & administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents written with our seals and dated this 17th day of July 1837

The condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the above bound Jeremiah Stephenson has been duly appointed by the Court of Southampton County, to serve as constable within the upper district of St Lukes parish in the said County for the term of two years from the date hereof: Now if the said Stephenson shall well and truly discharge the duties of the office of constable within said district during his continuance therein then this obligation is to be void otherwise to remain in full force & virtue.

This Indenture made this 18th day of February in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred thirty three between Arthur M. Holleman Trustee to a certain deed in Trust made to him by Arthur Holleman: to w^{it} to Elias Summerville, the (payment of certain sums of money) therein mentioned, for which the said Summerville was ~~made~~ Hollemans security, as will more fully appear by reference to said deed, which is of record in the Clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton, of the one part and Levi Summerville of the other part. Witnesseth that the above named Arthur M. Holleman, Trustee as aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and two dollars to him in hand paid or secured to be paid Levi Summerville at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained & sold and by these presents doth bargain & sell unto the said Levi C. Summerville, all the right title and interest conveyed to him by Arthur Holleman in the above named deed of Trust to a certain Tract of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton, known by the name of Capt. Arthur Hollemans old place it being the same which he received from the heirs of his brother Isaac Holleman supposed to contain four hundred acres be the same more or less and bounded by the Lands of the said A. M. Holleman John Williamson John Arguehart and John S. Bunting with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the said Land with the Tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of these right members and appurtenances unto the said Levi C. Summerville, his heirs and assigns forever and the said Arthur M. Holleman Trustee, as aforesaid and his heirs the said Land with all and singular the appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Levi C. Summerville his heirs and assigns free from the claims or claims of him the said Arthur M. Holleman Trustee as aforesaid his heirs and assigns forever and all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall will and as warrant and forever defend all the right title and interest ^{received} in him as Trustee to said deed in Trust and no more to him the said Levi C. Summerville his heirs and assigns forever by these presents. In Witness whereof the said Arthur M.
