This Indenture made this thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hun-
dred and thirty seven, between William L. Rawlings of the first part and Richard Griffin Bryson, David Dunlap
Bryson and Walter A. Caloe of the other part. Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve Thousand and
one Dollars by the said Bryson Bryson and Caloe to him the said Rawlings in hand paid, the receipt whereof the said
Rawlings doth hereby acknowledge, he, the said Rawlings hath bargained and sold and he doth by these presents bargain
and sell, alien in full & confirm unto the said Bryson, Brysons and Caloe, a certain tract or parcel of land, lying and
being in the County of Southampton containing six thousand four hundred and forty eight acres, to the same more or less,
and bounded as will more fully appear by reference to a deed from R. G. Bryson and wife D. D. Bryson and wife John A.
Bryson and wife, Miles L. Bryson and wife, Mon A. Soldens and wife John D. Saunders wife and W. H. Caloe to said
Rawlings dated January 8th 1837 and by another deed from Fleming B. Miller and Elizabeth A. his wife, dated Jan-
uary 14th 1837 which deeds are recorded or to be recorded, in the County Court of Southampton; the tract of land herein
and hereby conveyed being the same formerly owned by late William Allen decd. and conveyed to said Rawlings by
said deeds - together with all and singular the advantages & appurtenances unto the said Land belonging; or in any way ap-
