This Indenture made this 1st day of Augt. in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between William Stephenson of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part, and James Norrell Jewell of the said County and State of the second part and Augustine Pifer of the third part all of the aforesaid County of Southampton and State of Virginia: Witnesseth that whereas the said William Stephenson stands bound for a just debt due to the said James Norrell the sum of two hundred and ninety six dollars by bond bearing even date with this Indenture, witnesseth that the said William Stephenson is hereby willing and desirous of leaving the said James Norrell for an inconsideration of the of the sum of one dollar in hand paid by the said Norrell of one dollar in hand paid by the said Augustine Pifer half from two bargained and sold and by these presents with grant bargain and sell unto the said Augustine Pifer and to his heirs and assigns for ever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton it being the tract of Land that the said William Stephenson now occupies containing ten acres bounded by the well known line, also two feather beds and furniture, two chest & one spinning wheel two fine turkeys eight Hens, eight heads of hog, two heads of Cattle three iron pots one pair of Iron Stages two double iron cooking stoves one iron for washing into two iron plates two iron pot racks two cooking axes & a parcel of Books, one base of knives & forks seven heads of yearling hoes, one grubber all upon special trust and confidence to and for the following intent & purposes of discharging the above mentioned debt and to be the said Augustine Pifer may and shall at any time hereafter being lawfully requested by either of the parties viz. at public auctions. To be also the body of horse & fodder and all fine sale - for ready money alone so much of the aforesaid property as will be of value sufficient to pay and satisfy the aforesaid debt, intent and both of carrying into effect these presents giving ten days notice, the over plus of any thing due to the said William Stephenson his heirs or assigns.
