

Whereas by a due date second December 1834 made by Charles Smith & Richard P. Clements and duly acknowledged & recorded in Jefferson County Court in the State of Virginia, it was agreed and covenanted that he had of certain Negroes, to wit, Stephen a man, Mary a woman & her child Peggy, & their increase should be applied to the benefit of Polly Smith wife of the said Charles during her lifetime & at her death the title to said Negroes to go to the children of the said Polly & Charles - Now know all men by these presents that we the said Charles Smith & Polly Smith of Somerton County in the State of Alabama have this day made, ordained constituted and appointed Master M. Smith of said County of Limestone our true and lawful attorney, for us and in our names, or on the name of either of us to sue demand and receive of you for the increase and hire of said slaves which has already accrued of and from any individual whatever into whose hands the same have come and who may be liable for the same, and upon receipt thereof by, or payment thereof to our said attorney, a general release or discharge for the same to make execuse of others. And the said Charles & said Polly further authorize our said attorney for us and in our names to receive the said slaves Stephen, Mary & Peggy & the increase of said female slaves, of & from any person or persons in whose possession they may be and upon receipt thereof by our said attorney, a release or discharge for the same for the sum to make execuse and release, hereby ratifying, confirming & allowing whatsoever our said Attorney shall lawfully do in the premises. In testimony whereof we the said Charles Smith & Polly Smith have hereunto set our hands this 6th day of June 1837.

Pitman the receipt whereof the said Harry Coop & wife aforesaid do hereby acknowledge and hereby therewith fully satisfied, hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents sold fully and freely absolutely, give grant bargain claim infeoff convey and have, conform unto him the said Mathey S. Pitman his heirs and assigns (forwrit or certain tract or parcels of Land lying and being) in the aforesaid County of Southampton on the east side of St. Neots River containing one hundred acres more or less (known as the Jordan
