This Indenture made the 18th day of August in the year of our Lord Christ One Thousand, eight hundred and Thirty seven between Edwin B. Claude and Martha his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Rydor Lundy of the County aforesaid of the other part. Whereas that for and in consideration of the sum of Ninety four dollars to the said Edwin B. Claude in hand paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said Rydor Lundy his heirs executors and administrators for ever by these presents. The said Edwin B. Claude and Martha his wife have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, infested, released and confirmed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release and confirm unto the said Rydor Lundy his heirs and assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of Land and situate, lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation fifteen and three fourths acres, to the same more or less bounded as follows (to wit) beginning at a white oak near the road a corner to Rydor Lundy thence along his line (beginning the Road 28 ft 11 1/4 pole to said Edwin B. Claude's corner thence a New Sheepfold line (joining) said Claude and East by poles to a Sheaf oak and North 66 1/2 poles to a persimmon a corner to Rydor Lundy on the North side of the Road along his line and N 85 1/2 E 11 poles to the beginning, with houses, out houses, outhouses buildings, woods, wares, water, water courses, meadows, swamps, profits, commodities hereditaments, appurtenances whatever belonging in any wise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder & remainderless, rents and profits thereof and the estate right title and interest we trust professed benefit claim and demand whatever of them the said Edwin B. Claude and Martha his wife in and to the same and every part and parcel thereof, to have and to hold the said Land and premises above mentioned to the said Rydor Lundy his heirs and assigns forever. Under the said Edwin B. Claude and Martha his wife the said tract or parcel of Land and premises hereby bargained and sold to the said Rydor Lundy he heirs and assigns for ever against all and every person and persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. In witness whereof we the said Edwin B. Claude and Martha his wife have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals the day and date above written.
