This Indenture made the 1st day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven in and between Elizabeth Johnson of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the 1st part and S. D. Williams of the same County and State of the 2nd part Witnesseth that the said Elizabeth Johnson for and in consideration of the sum of four thousand dollars lawful money to her in hand paid by the said S. D. Williams before the execution of this present (the receipt of which I hereby acknowledge) hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said S. D. Williams a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County and State aforesaid, bounded on the east by the Blackwater River on the South by J. J. Williams line on the West by the Land of Mary Cook to the line of Mary (Widow) to a spine & making a corner tree between S. D. Williams Mary (Widow) & Elizabeth Johnson thence with Robertson's line to the line of Nicks & Landon's heirs and North by the Land of George Kemp & Blackwater River, containing One hundred & thirteen acres, more or less, to the said S. D. Williams his heirs & assigns forever. And the said Elizabeth Johnson for herself her heirs & assigns forever and defends the said tract or parcel of Land, to have and to hold to him the said S. D. Williams his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim or claims of her, her heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever by these presents. This Indenture made this 35th day of February One thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Kinchen Williams and Rebecca of the County of Southampton and State of Va. of the one part and Matthew R. Pope of said County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Kinchen Williams and Rebecca his Wife in consideration of the sum of eight hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said Matthew R. Pope at the executing and delivery of this present (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain & sell unto the said Matthew R. Pope his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land lying and being in the County of Southampton (first aforesaid) containing one hundred and forty three acres more or less and bounded as follows on the South by S. D. Williams Road on the West by Mills & Hony on the North by John A. Turner and on the East by the Lands of Nathaniel Pope, it being the tract formerly belonging to Elsie Williams then to Mrs. Williams and lastly to Kinchen Williams together with all and singular of the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appertaining) with every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract of Land with all and singular thereof the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold every part and parcel thereof with every of their right members and appurtenances unto the said Matthew R. Pope his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Kinchen Williams and Rebecca his Wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Matthew R. Pope his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said Kinchen Williams and Rebecca his Wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever, shall, will, and so warrant and forever defend by the presents.
