 granted property as the trustee or their representatives hereby authorized to act, shall think sufficient for the payment
 and shall think proper to sell to the highest bidder for ready money at publick auction after having first the
 time & place at his own discretion and given ten days' notice thereof, and also notified the same, by advertisement,
 to be set up at the door of the Court house of Southampton County, or some court say, previous to the day of sale and
 out of the moneys arising from such sale shall, after satisfying the charges thereof and all other expences attending,
 pay to the said James Atkinson his executors, assigns or assigns the said sum of one hundred & nine dollars with the

 eight dollars current money of Virginia in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained
 and sold and by these presents, do grant, bargain & sell unto the said Matthew Drake and his heirs a certain tract or parcel
 of Land in the County of Southampton aforesaid being the same Land which the said Thomas N. Joyner purchased of
 James Blythe and Amy his Wife (as by their deed of bargain & sale and is of record in the County Court of Southampton
 containing, by estimation thirty seven and a half acres, be the same more or less) and bounded by the lands of Thomas Dick-
 low, Morris Dick, John Drake, Sherry, David and Thomas N. Joyner's other land is a reference to the said deed James
 Blythe and Amy his Wife will more fully explain, to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land unto the said
