This Indenture made and entered into this 20th day of August 1837 in and between Margaret Story of the first part & Jane Holt of the second part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Margaret Story hath bargained and leased and as by these presents bargained and leased unto the said Jane Holt her heirs and assigns during the natural life of the said Margaret Story one certain tract or parcel of Land (lying and being) in the aforesaid State and less extent of Saint Luke's parish it being the tract of Land owned by Samuel Story and given to the said Margaret Story, his wife, during his life it being all the Plantation owned by the said Samuel Story in Saint Luke's parish, to have and to hold with all its rents and profits and appendages and the said Jane Holt binds herself her heirs and assigns to pay unto the said Margaret Story on the 30th day of next December thirty five dollars and on the 30th day of next December during the life of the said Margaret Story, and the said Jane Holt promises and binds herself and heirs to pay the sum of thirty five dollars, and the said Margaret Story conveys all his right and title in the aforesaid land to the said Jane Holt her heirs and assigns.
