Sunday & Wife to Sledge

This Indenture made this 18th day of Sept. In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Byrd Sunday & Rebecca Sunday his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Sterling Sledge of the said County & State aforesaid of the other part (Witnesseth) that the said Byrd & Rebecca his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & nine dollars & twenty cents to them in hand paid by the said Sterling Sledge hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Sterling Sledge a certain tract or parcel of Land which the said Sunday (purchased at the sale of John Shepherd Senr dead lying and being in the County and State aforesaid and containing by a late survey twenty three acres be the same, more or less, and bounded as follows, to wit: beginning at a red oak bush on the road as corner to Jas Harris then along said road as it meanders to the said Sledge's line along his line N 22° E 96 poles N 61° W 57 1/2 poles N 14° W 38 1/2 poles to the said Jas. Harris's line along his line N 73° E 27 poles to a stake a new corner to the said Jas Harris then along his line S. 19° E 62 poles to an apple tree N 4° E 50 poles and S 15° W 78 poles to the beginning. To have and to hold the same bargained and sold premises with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the said Sterling Sledge his heirs executors, administrators and assigns. The right title claims or interests of the said Sunday we warrant and shew defend against all and every other person or persons whatsoever. Nick to Sledge's trustee Ex^o John M. Gentry

This Indenture made and entered into this 11th day of September 1837 between Williams Nick of first part, Henry Blou of the second part and John M. Gentry of the third part: Whereas Williams Nick stands justly indebted to the said Henry Blou by bond bearing equal date with these presents for the sum of Three Hundred and thirty eight dollars and 88 cents, also one other bond bearing equal date payable on the 1st day of October next for the sum of forty two dollars & 88 cents, as well as unto which also together - the interest accruing thereon and the cost attending these presents, the said Williams Nick is owing and accountable to: Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and for the full and entire release of the sum of one dollar of lawful money to the said Williams Nick in hand paid by the said Henry Blou at and for the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said Williams Nick hath given, granted, bargained and sold, alien, conveyed, released and confirmed and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain and sell, alien, release and confirm to the said Henry Blou his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton, on the south side of Watawung River containing three hundred acres of land more or less, bounded by the lands of Joshua Nick & others and lying immediately on Watawung River then the following slaves, to wit:

with all and singular the appurtenances, to the said tract or parcel of Land belonging or in any
