And the said Williams Vick for himself his heirs executors and administrators doth hereby covenant promise and agree to say, that he the said Williams Vick, his heirs executors and assigns, the aforesaid tract parcel of land and premises with the appurtenances together with the slaves aforesaid hereby conveyed unto the said Henry Blow his heirs executors administrators and assigns against the claim of all persons whatsoever, shall will, warrant and forever defend by these presents, upon special trust, nevertheless that the said Henry Blow his heirs executors administrators and assigns shall permit the said Williams Vick to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances together with the slaves aforesaid hereby conveyed and take the profits thereof to his own use until default be made in payment of the aforesaid sum of money either in part or the whole, and then upon this further trust that the said Henry Blow his heirs executors, administrators and assigns shall and will as soon after the happening of such default of payment as he may be requested within by the said Jas M Gentry his heirs executors and administrators or at the request of the said Williams Vick his heirs executors and assigns, shall advertise and sell at public auction, the land and premises with the appurtenances together with the aforesaid slaves after giving at least thirty day previous notice of the time and place of such sale, at three or more public places within the County, and out of the proceeds of such sale first satisfy the cost of charges attend these presents, then pay and satisfy the debt aforesaid and the interest accruing thereon and the surplus if any remains pay to the said Williams Vick or his heirs. But if the aforesaid debt & cost are fully satisfied, then this Indenture to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue. This Indenture made this fourteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between George Johnson of the one part and Thomas Johnson of the other part, both of the County of Southampton Minisiphi that the said George Johnson for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Johnson before the making and delivery of this present (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) he the said George Johnson has bequeathed and sold and by these presents has bargained and sold unto the said Thomas Johnson a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton on Hoggy Run Swamp and bounded on the south by the lands belonging to the estate of Noel Maddill decd, on the east by those of Jeremiah Milford and on the north by those of Samuel Mollaw, it being the same land lately conveyed by said Thomas Johnson wife to Shad C. Jones & James Hallbell, and from them to Martha D. Storygrant, and from her to the said George Johnson, together with all and singular the improvements, houses, building, ways waters &c. To have and to hold to them the said Thomas Johnson for and during his natural life, with remainder to the said George Johnson. And the said George Johnson for himself, his heirs and assigns hereby warrants to title of the said tract of land to the said George Johnson for and during his natural life as aforesaid.
