This Indenture made and entered into this 21st day of November 1836 between Edwards of the County of Southampton and John B. Lawrence of the same County of the other part. Whereas by a decree of the County Court of Southampton pronounced at the September Term 1836 in a cause then depending between Daniel C. Butts and the Plaintiff against Edwards Butts Defendant it was decreed and ordered that the said Edwards Butts who was thereby adjudged liable to pay off against the Plaintiff the sum of five hundred dollars "after giving one month's notice by advertisement in writing" forthwith at the front door of the fourth house of the County of Southampton, and at one or more public places forced to sell at public auction to the highest bidder upon a credit of twelve months the tract or parcels of land in the bill mentioned containing between two and three hundred acres situated in the County of Southampton adjoining the lands of John Stephen the heir of Solomon Turner and those of which Elizabeth Abbott died seized and after deducting the cost of the said suit and expenses of the sale divide the net amount of sales among the parties; and whereas in pursuance of the said decree the said Edwards Butts did on the 21st day of November 1836 cause to sell the lands aforesaid in two lots that is to say the tract of land of Elizabeth Abbott died seized containing about two hundred acres to the same man or his representative of the name and place of sale being given as directed by the decree above referred to now whereas at the sale so made the said John B. Lawrence became the purchaser of the said tract of land being the highest bidder therefor at the sum of five hundred and eighty dollars. This Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said Edwards Butts for and in consideration of the said sum of five hundred and eighty dollars to him in hand paid by the said John B. Lawrence before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain sell and convey unto the said John B. Lawrence his heirs and assigns the tract or parcel of land herein before described (and which was sold by the said Edwards Butts at public auction as aforesaid) together with the appurtenances thereto belonging. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances to the said John B. Lawrence, his heirs and assigns, to the only proper use and benefit of the said John B. Lawrence his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Edwards Butts for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators covenant to and with the said John B. Lawrence his heirs and assigns that he will forever warrant and defend the said tract of land hereby conveyed with the buildings and improvements thereon, and the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said John B. Lawrence, his heirs and assigns against the claim of the said Edwards Butts and all persons claiming the same or any part thereof by, from, through and under whom the said Edwards Butts, but against the claim of no other person whomsoever. In witness whereof the said Edwards Butts hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year first herein written.
