Moore trustee and his heirs forever. Upon trust on our selves that the said trust is to return possession of the said property until required by the said Reddick to sell whereupon the said James T. Moore trustee shall after advertising the time & place of sale & sell the said property herein conveyed and pay the said debt of one hundred and five dollars & 31/100 with interest lost &c the balance if any of the money raised from such sale to be paid over to the said Long.
