This Indenture made and entered into on this 16th day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and Thirty  
seven between Matthew Pipe & Diocy Pipe his Wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Mills  
Gray of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Matthew Pipe and Diocy his Wife for and in  
consideration of the sum of One hundred & Eighty eight dollars 12/100 current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said  
Mills Gray at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted,  
begun, sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents do and each of them doth grant, bargain, sell, alien,  
enfeoff and confirm unto him the said Mills Gray his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land situate  
lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke's, containing by a late survey Forty five  
and one fourth acres (to the same more or less) and bounded as follows, to wit beginning at a small sweet gum standing on the  
North edge of buck horn swamp a mes corner for the said Matthew Pipe & Mills Gray on John A. Turner's line, thence a due east  
line of mulberry trees 15 1/2 & 158 poles to the center of Potters Pond thence along said pond 1.65 1/2 & 29 1/2 poles, thence 8 1/4 poles  
to a point a corner for said Mills Gray there his line N 17° 11' poles to a red oak tree N 73° W 13' poles to a red oak, thence  
N 65 1/2 poles to a red oak, thence N 6° W 17' poles to a post oak standing near a small branch thence down the run of said  
branch N 26° W 52 poles, thence N 3 1/2° E 16 poles, thence N 48° W 15 1/2 poles to a white oak standing on the north edge of sd  
Buckhorn Swamp a corner for said Mills Gray in the said John A. Turner's line, thence on the edge of said Swamp N 68°  
E 22 poles, thence E 25 poles thence N 63 1/2 E 22 poles, thence S 71 1/2 E 2 poles to the first station. Together with all right  
titles interest claims or demands for in and to the above described tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances thereto be-  
longing or in any way appertaining. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and premises with all and  
singular its appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the said Mills Gray his heirs and assigns forever (to and for the only  
purpose use and behoof of him the said Mills Gray his heirs and assigns forever). And the said Matthew Pipe and Diocy his  
Wife for themselves their heirs executors and administrators to and each of them doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Mills  
Gray his heirs executors administrators and assigns that they will by these presents warrant and forever defend all the right  
and titles of the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land and every part or parcel thereof against the claims or demands of all  
and every other person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof the said Matthew Pipe and Diocy Pipe his Wife have  
hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first above written.
