This Indenture made This 16. day of Octo. A.D. 1837 between Nathan Pope and Nancy his wife of the County of Southampton of the one part and Matthew R. Pope of the said County and State of the other part, Thinketh that the said Nathan Pope and Nancy his Wife, for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which we bear to Matthew R. Pope son of said Nathan Pope as well as for the further consideration of one acre to them in hand paid by the said Matthew R. Pope at the sealing of these presents, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Matthew R. Pope his heirs executors &c a certain parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton as aforesaid containing two acres and twenty six acres more or less and bounded as follows, on North by Edwin Miller, used by Drury Miller and Kinches Williams land formerly Elisha Williams and their Wm. Williams deal on the east by the lands of Rick Stewart formerly Millers East Thence from a small red oak in said Stewarts line, a new made corner a straight line about 1 Met. lower to said Mr. Williams' line on the West, it being about one half of the tract formerly belonging to Nathan T. Foster in which said half are included the houses &c. Together with all and singular of the appurtenances herein before mentioned or intended to be given and granted with every part and parcel, & how and to whom the said parcel of land with all and singular the promises herein before mentioned or intended to be given and granted and every part & parcel thereof with every of their rights member and appurtenances, unto the said Matthew R. Pope his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Nathan Pope and Nancy his wife for themselves and their heir the said parcel of land with all & singular the promises and appurtenances before mentioned, unto the said Matthew R. Pope his heirs and assigns, free from the claims or demands of them the said Nathan Pope and Nancy his wife or either of them, their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall, will and do warrants and forever defend by these presents in witness whereof the said Nathan Pope & Nancy his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day & year above written.

This Indenture made and entered into this 16th day of October 1837 by and between Jacob Barnes fit  
one part, and Benjamin Bunn of the other part each of whom resides in the County of Southampton in the State of Vir  
ginia this indenture witnesseth that the said Jacob Barnes had for and in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand  
and 45 Dollars of which he hereby acknowledges have bargained and sold by these presents (the receipt  
of which is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold by these presents with grant bargain and sell unto the  
said Benjamin Bunn and certain tract or parcels of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton  
and bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at the publick bridge over the run of the north east branch of former part  
of the Millpond from thence down said run or brook to the run of the said brook swamp in said hill back then  
down said swamp (passing) said William Miller's line thence along said latter line to form a straight line  
of new Road thence along said straight and new road to its intersection with the old and former road thence westward
