Know all men by these presents that we Samuel H Holmes and Benjamin Griffin are heirs and formerly bound unto the President and directors of the Literary Fund and their successors in office in the just and full sum of Two Thousand dollars to which payment well and truly to be made to the said President and directors of the Literary Fund and their successors in office we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents.

Presented with our Seal and dated this 20th day of November 1837. The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the above bound Samuel H Holmes was on the 10th day of October 1837, by the School Commissioners in and for the County of Southampton, appointed their treasurer for the year ending on the 31st day of December 1838; now of the said Samuel H Holmes shall faithfully apply and account for all monies which may come to his hands by virtue of his Office and shall do, perform and execute all and every act and thing appertaining to his said Office according to law then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

This Indenture made and entered into the 2d. day of December in the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred and thirty two between John Drake of the first part, Martha Drake of the second part and Sixth St Bishop of the third part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that whereas the said John Drake stands justly indebted to the said Martha Drake by his note bearing the same date with this writing, in the sum of One hundred & fifty dollars and the said John Drake being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the said sum of money unto the said Martha Drake, both as well for and in consideration of the premises as for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Martha Drake, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and confirm, unto the said Martha Drake his heirs and assigns forever all his, the said John Drakes right, title and interest in the lands now owned and occupied by Mary Drake (widow of Jeremiah Drake deceased) as her dower right which was laid off and assigned to her by Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Southampton together with its advantages, emoluments, hereditaments, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever the said land (and appertaining) or belonging unto the said Martha Drake her heirs and assigns forever to and for the use and benefit of the said Martha Drake her heirs and assigns forever. Nevertheless upon this express condition that should the said John Drake his heirs or assigns pay or cause to be paid unto the said Martha Drake her heirs or assigns on or before the 2d. day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty three the aforesaid sum of one hundred and fifty dollars. Then and in that case this present writing to be void and of no effect but should the said John Drake his heirs or assigns fail or refuse to pay the aforesaid sum of money or any part thereof unto the said Martha Drake her heirs or assigns, then and in that case it shall be lawful for the said Sixth St Bishop (who is mutually chosen by the parties as Trustee) to sell at public auction after giving twenty days notice by advertisement at the front door of the Court house and two or three of the most public places in the neighborhood of the said lands all the said John Drake's rights and interest in the said lands and out of the proceeds pay or cause to be paid unto the said Martha Drake her heirs or assigns the aforesaid sum of money with all the interest which may have accrued and all cost incurred by this writing, and the balance, if any over to the said John Drake his heirs or assigns. And it is further agreed by the parties to these presents that in case of a sale it shall be lawful for the said Sixth St Bishop to convey to the purchaser or purchasers a full and complete deed for said lands conveying to them their heirs and assigns the fee simple right in said lands to them their heirs and assigns forever, and do all other acts which counsel, learned in the law, may advise for the lawful execution of the present writing.
