This Indenture made the 16th day of September 1837 between Drury Bittle and Elizabeth his
 wife of the one part and Peter Edwards of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Vir-
 ginia. Whereas that the said Drury Bittle and Elizabeth his wife in consideration of the sum of Twenty
 nine dollars lawful money of this Commonwealth, to them in hand paid by the said Peter Edwards at or
 before the execution of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by
 these presents in each of them bargain and sells unto the said Peter Edwards his heirs and assigns forever all
 their right title and interest of them the said Drury Bittle and Elizabeth his wife in a tract of land lying
 in the said County and State of Virginia, formerly belonging to John Tilgham containing twenty one
 be the same, more or less and bounded as follows beginning at a corner in Louis Waller's line thence along
 Waller's to Harris' and thence along Harris' to the said Peter Edwards and so on to the beginning and
 also another tract of land containing Seventy one acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows
 beginning at a red oak a corner next to Harris' and the said Peter Edwards line, thence along Edwards
 to Louis Waller's line, thence along Waller's to Fielding Ross's line, thence along Ross's to Harris', to
 the beginning: these lands being the dower of Mrs. Nancy Tilgham with her son Joseph A. Joyner intermarried;
 and the said Drury Bittle and Elizabeth his wife for themselves and their heirs with all and singular the
 premises before mentioned unto the said Peter Edwards his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims
 of all persons whatsoever as warrant and defend by these presents. In witness whereof the said Drury
 Bittle and Elizabeth his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year above written.
