Bryant doth hereby acknowledge the said Bryant hath granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and
by these presents doth grant bargain and sell also enfeoff and confirm unto the said Jethro Loff his heirs and assigns
for ever a certain tract or parcel of land containing six acres more or less situated lying in the County of Southampton
and bounded as follows beginning at a gum standing in a branch so running down the branch to a gum and
from thence a line of marked trees to a old oak a corner of the said land and thence running a strait line of mar-
ked trees the beginning and also all trees woods underwood commons and commonage for his commodities
whatsoever to the said land above mentioned belonging or in any way appertaining and
also reversion and reversions remainders rents and services of the said premises and every part thereof rights
titles interests claims and defends whatsoever of them the said Jordan Bryant and Martha his wife and Sally Bryant
of or to the same premises and every part thereof to have and to hold all and singular the said premises above
mentioned and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Jethro Loff his heirs and assigns
for ever. And the said Jordan Bryant for himself his heirs or assigns the said tract or parcel of land with the appur-
tenances above mentioned and every part thereof against them and their heirs executors administrators and assigns and
against all and every person whatsoever the said Jethro Loff his heirs executors admrs. or assigns shall and will

This Indenture made and entered into this 21st day of November 1836 between Leon Powers Committee and
Administrator as bonds man with the will annexed of Thomas Gray deceased of the one part and John Donnelly of the other
part both of the County of Southampton. Whereas the said Thomas Gray deceased late of the said County of South-
ampton died by his last Will and Testament among other things directeth that all his just debts should be paid, for the
purpose of doing which he divided and subjected all his estate, real and personal of every nature and kinds as well bonds
and accounts as all and every claim and claims to which he was entitled of every nature and kinds whatsoever
and gave to his executors discretionary power of disposing at private sale of his land or other property of the value could
be obtained or has for it. And the said Thomas Gray did by his said last Will and Testament constitute and appoint
his sons Thomas R. Gray and Edwin Gray and his friend Gilbert Gustavus G. Gray executors and his daughter Ann
Gray executors therof. Whereas the said Will was proved and admitted to Record in the County Court of
