This Indenture made this the 29th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
 & thirty seven between Bennet J. Griffin of the first part Thomas J. Pottow of the second part and Thomas Pottow  
 of the third part: whereas the said Bennet J. Griffin is justly indebted to the said Thomas Pottow in the sum of four  
 hundred & twenty dollars as by a note bearing date on the 28th of November 1837 more fully appears, which note  
 with the legal interest thereon accruing the said Bennet J. Griffin is willing & desirous to secure, Now this Indenture  
 witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the consideration of one dollar of lawful money  
 of the state of Virginia to the said Bennet J. Griffin in hand paid by the said Thomas J. Pottow at & by the said  
 day and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged to the said Bennet J. Griffin shall give  
 granted, conveyed, aliened, possessed, released, confirmed and by these presents doth give, grant bargain sell, alien, convey  
 release & confirm to the said Thomas J. Pottow & his heirs by assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land lying  
 & being in the County of Southhampton and in the parish of Northway containing two hundred & fifty acres  
 the same more or less being the tract whereon I now live and bounded as follows, on the east by the land of Thomas  
 Hunley, on the West by John Charles's land, on the north by George Johnson & Thomas Munley's & on the south by Thomas  
 Jaynes's & Matthew Mills land; with all & singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of land belonging or in  
 any wise appertaining & all the estate, right, title & interest, of the said Bennet J. Griffin in and to the said granted or  
 intended to be hereby granted tract or parcel of land & its appurtenances unto the said Thomas Pottow  
 his heirs executors & administrators forever and the said Bennet J. Griffin for himself his heirs executors and adminis-  
 trators doth hereby covenant promise and agree with the said Thomas J. Pottow his heirs executors administrators or assigns  
 forever in manner and form following that is to say that the said Bennet J. Griffin his heirs, executors, administrators  
 or assigns the aforesaid tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances & premises unto the said Thomas J. Pottow his  
 heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, against all persons whatsoever shall & will warrant & forever defend by  
 these presents - Upon trust nevertheless that the said Thomas J. Pottow his executors & administrators shall permit the  
 said Bennet J. Griffin to remain in quiet possession of the said parcel of land & premises with its appurtenances &  
 take the profits thereof to his own use until default be made in the payment of the said sum of four hundred and twenty  
 dollars which in whole or in part of the same of Thomas Pottow his heirs executors administrators or assigns shall request  
 with the said tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances to the highest bidder for ready money shall  
 having given ten days notice by advertising the same at the Court House door or any other public place in the neigh-  
 hood of the said land and of the monies arising from the sale shall after satisfying the charges thereof and all  
 other expenses attending the premises pay to the said Thomas Pottow his heirs executors administrators or assigns the  
 said sum of four hundred & twenty dollars with the interest which thereon may have accrued and the balance
