This Indenture made this eleventh day of December eighteen hundred and thirty seven between James Joyner of the County of Southampton of the one part & James Broadshaw and Nancy his wife of the several County of the other part witnesseth that the sd James Joyner for and in consideration of the full and just sum of three hundred dollars current money of Virginia to be paid by the said James Joyner thereon hands paid over before the execution and delivery of these presents to the receipt whereof the said James Joyner with herby abandons leaves and therefore quits and discharges the said James Broadshaw and Nancy his wife, his heirs and assigns forever and themselves thenceforth fully and entirely satisfied, contented and peace, have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, left and confirmed by these presents, do grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release, set over, deliver, and confers unto him the said James Broadshaw and to his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation plantation tract of land of land wherein the said James Broadshaw now lives (or being) the tract I purchased of James Joyner situated lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and containing by estimation sixty one and a half acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at a black gum corner tree thence along down the run of Jacks branch, bounded by Jonathan Lankfords line to the back River then up the said River, then to Blackwater river, then down the said River to the mouth of the broad gut, then through the Island bounded by land known to the deep branch then up the said branch to a white to a white corner tree thence along a straight line to a corner tree bounded by William Joyner to the beginning, with all houses out houses edifices buildings wood water & water footings hereditaments & appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion and reversion, remainders and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof, and all the estate, right, title interest claim or demands of them the said James Joyner of, or any to the sd - every part thereof to have & to hold the plantation tract of land aforesaid of land and promises aforesaid unto him the said James Broadshaw his heirs and assigns forever. And the said James Joyner & Nancy his wife, for them themselves their heirs executors & assigns the said plantation of a half acre & premises with all & every the appurtenances aforesaid against him the said James Joyner and Nancy his wife his heirs and against all persons whatsoever claiming or demands the said or any part thereof shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.
