& delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said A. M. Howell doth hereby acknowledge & therefore acquit & discharge the said
James Joyner his heirs & assigns forever and themselves therewith & entirely satisfied, contented and paid have granted &
bargained and sold aliened & released an confirmed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release, set
over delivered and confirm unto him the said James Joyner and his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation mess-
age, tract and parcel of land wherow the said James Joyner now lives & being the tract I purchased of A. M. Howell
situated lying in the County of Southampton aforesaid and containing by estimation sixty five acres to the
some more or less and bounded as follows: To wit, beginning at a postern tree at corner just made thence bounded
by a line of a marsh tree to a corner tree of said Land and in the branch, which is a postern thence up the branch
to a sweet gourd thence a line of marsh trees to a pine corner of Joshua Joyner line thence along a line of marsh
to a pine corner tree of Rddy Drake, thence along said line to a red oak a corner of Rddy Drake thence bounded
by said line to a pine corner of S. Land and thence a straight line to the beginning, with all houses, out houses
edifices buildings woods ways, waters ways hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging on it

This Indenture made this seventh day of December 1837 between James Brashaw of the County of South-

County of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said James Brashaw stands indebted by bond to the said
A. M. Howell in the sum of three hundred dollars, whereas for the further assurance of the payment it is
agreed by the parties hereunto that a conveyance in trust shall be made to the said Stephen Murdaugh for the
receipt of the said A. M. Howell in case the said bond shall not be punctually paid with lawfull interest thereon
on or before the first day of January next. Now this indenture witnesseth that the said James Brashaw for
and in consideration of the premises and for the further sum of three hundred dollars to him in hand paid,
the receipt of which is acknowledged has bargained and sold by these presents unto the said Stephen Murdaugh his heirs
executors administrators give grant, bargain and sells unto the said Stephen Murdaugh his heirs & assigns all
that tract or parcels of Land wherow the said James Brashaw now lives lying in the said County of Southampton
containing by estimation sixty one & a half acres to the same, more or less also the personal estate belonging
