This indenture made and entered into on 18th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Benjamin C. Baines of the first part Debit Collector to the trustee of the second part and Ann Baines of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Whereas the Benjamin Baines stands justly indebted to the said Ann Baines by bond bearing date October the first 1825, of one hundred and thirty five dollars which debt with the legal interest thereon accruing the said Benjamin C. Baines is willing and so comes to record. Now This indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar lawful money of Virginia to the said Benjamin C. Baines in hand paid by the said Debit Collector trustee at and before the sealing and delivery of the said indenture the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Benjamin C. Baines hath given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed, released and confirmed to the said Debit Collector his heirs and assigns forever, one Bay Horse bridled and saddled with all the right title and claim and interest the said Benjamin C. Baines hath to the Horse, bridle and saddle. To have and to hold the said hereby granted Horse, bridle & saddle unto the said Debit Collector trustee his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Benjamin C. Baines for himself his heirs Executors and administrators doth hereby covenant promise and agree to and with the said Debit Collector his heirs, Executors &c and assigns forever that the aforesaid Horse, bridle and saddle conveyed unto the said Debit Collector trustee his heirs &c against the claim of all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by their presents. Upon trust nevertheless that the said Debit Collector his heirs &c shall permit the said Benjamin C. Baines to remain in quiet possession of the said Horse, bridle and saddle until default to be made in the payment of the sum of one hundred and thirty five dollars either in the whole or in part and then upon this further trust that the said Debit Collector or his heirs &c or assigns shall and will soon after the happening of such default of payment as or they may think proper in the said Ann Baines her heirs Executors &c and assigns shall request sell the aforesaid Horse, bridle and saddle conveyed to the said Trustee or his Representatives, hereby authorized to act to the highest bidder for ready money at public sale or auction after having given the time & place of sale at their own discretion and give at least ten days notice previous of the time and place, and out of the moneys arising from such sale satisfy the said Ann Baines the sum of one hundred & thirty five dollars and the balance if any, shall pay to the said Benjamin C. Baines his heirs or order or that no assent of payment be made then this indenture to be void or else to remain in full force, power and virtue.
