That the said Parsons Turner for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and twenty nine dollars \$219 lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid at or before the sealing of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath bargained, granted and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Daniel H. Drongold his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land, part of the tract known as the Indian land containing by survey fifty one acres, adjoining the lands of Lewis Morell which he purchased from Henry and Green Turner lying between parallel lines running East and west on the eastern west by a line running north & south on the eastern boundary by a line N 18° E to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said Daniel H.
