This Indenture made and entered into this first day of October One Thousand Eight hundred and Ninety seven between Chasity Naughton of the County of Southampton and Parish of Netley, of the one part and William Joyner of the same County and Parish of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Chasity Naughton for the natural sum of five hundred and one dollar and fifty five cents current money of Virginia paid unto the said Chasity Naughton at or before the executing hereof, of three presents whereby the said Chasity Naughton hath acknowledged herself fully and completely satisfied and paid, and hath granted and sold unto the said William Joyner to him and to his heirs forever one certain and thirty acres of land be the same more or less with bearing the interest of Henry Camp their heirs and assigns at a spot oak corner at Joseph Billows thence down to a Spanish oak corner of Sautons Scotts line thence down the said line to a pine corner of William Joyner bounded by said line to a corner of Henry Camp land, on to foot line To gather with all houses out Houses raised building yards gardens ways water and water courses belonging, or in any wise appertaining, to have and to hold the said land unto the said William Joyner to him and to his heirs forever and the Chasity Naughton & herself her heirs & assigns with by these presents bargain sell to William Joyner his heirs and assigns that they will by these presents warrant and forever defend all rights titles claims and demands of any person or persons claiming a demanding the of any part or parcel thereof. This Indenture made this twenty second day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Julietta Potter (widow of Samuel Potter dead) of the County of Warren and State of Ohio, of the first part and Robert Potter of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, of the second part; Witnesseth that the said Julietta Potter for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred and Seventy five dollars, to her in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargain sold and conveyed, and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Robert Potter his heirs and assigns forever the following real estate to wit: her undivided interest in the lands thence by Richard and Julietta Potter (orphans of Saml Potter dead) from the estate of Joshua Potter and being situated in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, containing two hundred acres more or less and bounded as defined in a Deed for one half of said land, from Richard Potter (joint heir with Julietta Potter) to Robert Potter as aforesaid and bearing date of March 1833 & placed on the records of the County of Southampton as aforesaid. Also her undivided interest in a small lot of land adjoining the aforementioned tract, heretofore by Richard & Julietta Potter from Mary Ann Potter (one of the heirs of the estate of Joshua Potter dead) and designated in the aforesaid deed from Richard Potter to Robert Potter date as aforesaid, and all the estate, right, title and interest of the said Julietta Potter (widow) to and in the same. To have and to hold the said bargain premises, with all the appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Robert Potter, his heirs and assigns forever, and further the said Julietta Potter doth covenant, grant and agree to and with the said Robert Potter that she hath good right, full power and lawful authority, to sell and convey the same in manner and form aforesaid. And further that the said Julietta Potter (widow as aforesaid) her heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and forever defend the aforesaid premises and every part thereof to the said Robert Potter his heirs and assigns against all persons claiming the same by, from or under her or his or under any other person whatsoever.
