Barrett at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have given, granted,
bargained and sold by the presents to give grant bargain sell their estate and confirm unto the said Benjamin T. Barrett
certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton containing Two hundred and thirty
two acres be the same more or less in being the land assigned by Commissioners to the above named David Barrett, as his
inhabitable share of the lands of which James Barrett his father died seized and possessed for him Benjamin Barrett, to have and
to hold the said tract or parcel of land and every part and parcel thereof and all the right title interest and estate therein to him the
said Benjamin Barrett his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim of them the above named David Barrett and Hannah
his wife, and also free from the claims or claims of all and every person and persons whomsoever will and as by these presents
warrant and release the undersigned Justices simple of in and to the said Two hundred and thirty two acres of land as aforesaid.
